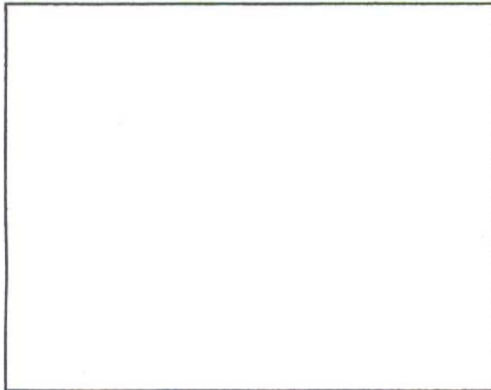

Terms and Conditions

- Program:** Historically, nearly every quarter-section held a family and farmyard, and nearly every farmyard had its own well as a source of water. Today, the number of farmyards has decreased dramatically, leaving many of the old wells abandoned and open to the surface. This program deals with the filling and sealing of these abandoned wells as a means of protecting the groundwater aquifer from potential contamination.
- Objective:** As abandoned wells threaten groundwater quality, and pose a variety of safety concerns in many areas, the aim of this program is to identify and properly seal the many wells left open and abandoned throughout the Conservation District, thereby protecting the quality of groundwater into the future.
- Eligibility:** Any known open abandoned well within the Intermountain Conservation District is eligible under this program.
- Assistance:** Funding for approved projects will be cost-shared between the concerned landowner, the Intermountain Conservation District, and any other potential funding sources. Cost to landowner is 25% of project cost, up to a maximum of \$100 per well.
Note: Should access to the site of any abandoned well be an issue, the construction of any necessary access route shall be the responsibility of the landowner/applicant.

General Information:

- All information, as to the number and locations of abandoned wells, gathered through this program will be used to identify areas of high well concentrations, and the overall location of the area's major aquifers.
- The annual projects resulting from this program will be subject to available funding. All projects to be approved by the IMCD prior to construction.
- The Conservation District shall determine application priorities in consultation with Subdistrict and Board Staff.
- Engineering and technical service for project design and construction will be subject to the availability of funding and/or staff. The Intermountain Conservation District reserves the right to establish priorities for providing such services and assistance.
